Subject: Weekly Update

I have just a few things to cover this week.

1. Game Reports - At tournaments the "Host School" is required to have an on-site Game Administrator and a certified lightning detector. In the event they don't, submit a game report with an explanation just as you would for an ejection.
2. GHSA Insignia - In 2008 the GHSA insignia became "mandatory". Failure to wear the GHSA insignia during GHSA sanctioned events will result in a fine to the local association, and possible exclusion of the guilty individual from post-season selection. The "certified" insignia is optional.
3. Travel Fees - Do NOT try to "stick it to" the host schools for excessive travel fees during tournaments. Travel Fees for tournaments should be negotiated prior to the tournament.
